Questions

Who was not afraid of Goliath? Why wasn't he afraid?

Questions

What did David ask about Goliath? What did David say to Goliath?

Answers

Goliath was over 9 feet tall. He wore armor that weighed over 125 pounds and carried a spear whose point weighed 15 pounds.

Answers

David, the young shepherd boy, was not afraid of Goliath. He knew the one true God was mightier than this giant man.

Answers

David asked who this Philistine was that would defy the armies of the living God. He also told Goliath that Goliath may come with a spear and javelin but that he, David, came in the name of the LORD of Hosts, the God of the armies of Israel.

What name of God did David use when he talked to Goliath?

Answers

The LORD of Hosts, JEHOVAH SABAOTH.

Questions

What does the LORD of Hosts mean?

Answers

A host is an army of angels. JEHOVAH-SABAOTH means that God is the commander of a multitude of angels. Those angels fight for the people of God.

Questions

What are some truths the Bible tells us about angels?

Answers

Angels obey God and do what He tells them to do. They are under God's authority and they do not act on their own. They only do God's will; Angels are God's messengers; Angels are God's warriors. They fight for the people of God and attack their enemies; Angels protect the people of God; Angels are powerful and God has legions (thousands and thousands) of them to do what he commands.

Questions

Why was Elisha's servant afraid when he looked outside?

Answers

Elisha's servant saw the enemy's army of horses and chariots had surrounded the city.

Questions

What did the servant not see?
What did Elisha do for the servant?

Answers

The servant could not see God's army and the chariots of fire on all the hills that surrounded Elisha. The servant was fearful because he could not see everything that God was doing. Elisha prayed and asked then Lord to open the servant's eyes so the servant could see the Lord's army of angels that was protecting Elisha and the city.

JEHOVAH-SABAOTH When you pray to JEHOVAH SABAOTH you are prying to a God so magnificent that all creation serves His purposes.
