Answers

God gave Moses the 10 Commandments and Moses gave the 10 Commandments to the Israelites. God promised Israel that He would protect them and give them victory. He told them He would love them, bless them, and cause them to multiply. He told them they would have fruitful crops and they would be free from the diseases He brought on the Egyptians.

Answers

Esau traded his birthright for a bowl of porridge/stew. This was a foolish trade for Esau to make. He traded great wealth for a meal!

Side 2:

Questions

Did Israel keep their part of the covenant? Did they do what God required of them? Did God bless them?

Answers

Israel did not keep their part of the covenant. They did evil and disobeyed God by worshipping other gods and treasuring something other than the one true God. God did NOT bless them. He had promised to bless an obedient people, not a disobedient people! Israel should NOT have expected God's blessing since they disobeyed Him.

Questions

What happened when Israel disobeyed God? Was this because God was not Jehovah-Saboath or Jehovah Nissi? Why did God allow this to happen?

Answers

God kept His Word and did NOT bless them since they had not obeyed Him. He allowed another group of people, the Midianites to have control over Israel for 7 years. God sent this punishment to Israel to turn them back to Him, to cause them to call out to Him as the one true God.

YAHWEH SHALOM, The Lord is Peace

Shalom is a Hebrew word that means more than our English word "peace". It means "safety", "completeness", "finished word", "perfection", "wellness".

It comes from living in harmony with God. When you pray to Yahweh Shalom, you are praying to the source of all peace.
