Question:

Who tempted Eve to sin?
Where did he come from?

Answer:

Satan (The Devil/Lucifer) tempted
Eve to sin. Satan/Lucifer was an an-
gel in Heaven who wanted to be like
God.

Question:

How did Satan/Lucifer
come to be on earth?

Question:

In Isaiah 14:12-15, what name
is Satan/Lucifer referred to?
What does passage say that
Satan/Lucifer tried to do? Was
he successful?

Answer:

There was a rebellion in Heaven among the angels led
by Satan/Lucifer. They turned against God and became
evil. God threw Satan/Lucifer and these other angels
out of Heaven. We call these fallen angels demons.

Answer:

Some translations say that Satan/Lucifer is called
"morning star" or "day star". This name means bearer
of light. Lucifer was not the light but only the bearer of
light. Lucifer tried to "raise his throne above the stars
of God" and "make himself like the Most High". God cast
Satan to the "depths of the pit".

Question:

Why did God cast Satan
out of Heaven?

Answer:

God is El Elyon the Most High and He will not allow
someone else to take His place. He is Greater than
all and above all, and will cast down anyone who
tries to exalt themselves above God. No one can
decide to be God. God is God alone!

Side 2:

Answer:

Who/what was Dagon? How did God show Himself to be El Elyon to the people of Ashdod? (1 Samuel 5:1-4)

Answer:

Dagon was a god that the people of Ashdod worshipped. When the Ark of the Covenant was captured by the Philistines, it was placed in Dagon's temple beside the idol, Dagon. The next day when the people got up, the idol, Dagon was fallen on the ground on his face before the ark of the LORD. The people set it back up and the next day the idol was on the ground again in front of the ark of the LORD. The idol's head and hands had been broken off and were lying on the ground. God is El Elyon and will not allow an angel or a god/idol to take His place.

Question:

What king tried to exalt himself above God? (Daniel 4:28-37)

Answer:

King Nebuchadnezzar.
